

December 14, 2012 **Information Updates**

The American Transmission Company (ATC) is proposing to reinforce the electric transmission grid in the Upper Peninsula of Michigan and Northeastern Wisconsin by building substations and erecting high voltage transmission lines through agricultural and residential properties.

Residents and property owners are concerned about personal health effects, loss of prime farm land, the effects of stray voltage, and decreased property values.

Residents and property owners are asking ATC and the Public Service Commission of Wisconsin to consider alternative routes (such as the existing business corridor of Hwy 41) which would have less severe impact on agricultural land and the families who live along the proposed future power line routes.
